**Whereas**, the Board of County Commissioners of Montrose County, Colorado, have determined that consistent procedures should be followed by all Montrose County elected officials, department heads, and staff for the disposal of surplus property; and



**Whereas**, Montrose County fosters effective broad-based competition within the free enterprise system to ensure that the County will dispose of surplus property in the best interest of Montrose County.

**Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved**, by the Board of County Commissioners of Montrose County, Colorado that the attached list of surplus equipment is hereby declared "Surplus Property", and that proper procedures be followed for its disposal through advertisement, trade, auction, or on-line auction, in accordance with said Fiscal Rule 10.

**Item to be declared Surplus Property**

1 – Wooden Office Desk. This desk was provided to the Montrose County Building Department when furniture was removed from another county building in the early 1970s. The desk has been used by county building staff since that time. The desk predates the use of computers in office operations and does not have features which make it compatible with cords, monitors or computer accessories. The desk is currently located in the County Planning and Development Department.

**Reason for Surplus:**

The desk is no longer needed due to the downsizing of the building department and is an older style which is no longer suitable for county purposes.
